Commander Joseph Leo McGrievy was born in Saint Louis, Missouri on 14 June 1918. After graduation from high school in 1936, Joe was sworn in as a Navy Recruit on 17 August of the same year.

Commander McGrievy's first sea duty assignment was on the Submarine Tender USS HOLLAND (AS-3), stationed in San Diego, CA. He was interested in the Signalman rating and became part of the communication division on the bridge. A Signalman on one of the Boats taught him Navigation and he was assigned temporary duty on the USS PICKEREL (SS-177). After a few months, it became permanent, thanks to the XO, E.W. Grenfell.

Joe was next sent to Portsmouth Naval Shipyard to be part of the commissioning crew of the USS SEARAVEN (SS-196) whose final destination was alongside USS CANOPUS (AS-9), a Submarine Tender in Manila Bay, Philippines.

Joe made four war patrols on **SEARAVEN**, taking part in the rescue of 34 Australian Air Force personnel and two U.S. Army fliers who happened to crash land on the island of Timor. For his part in the rescue, he was awarded the Navy Marine Corps Medal.

He was transferred to USS SKIPJACK (SS-184) and made one Patrol with Red Coe. SKIPJACK returned to Mare Island Naval Shipyard for a much needed overhaul. McGrievy was then transferred to the USS SEAHORSE (SS-304), as Chief of the Boat. Joe made six patrols on SEAHORSE, commanded by Slade Cutter, and received the Silver Star.

After six runs on the "HORSE", he went to USS CHIVO (SS-341). Three weeks later, CHIVO headed for a war patrol.

He married Lillian on the second of February, 1940, and they remained happily married for 68 years. Unfortunately, his shipmate for life passed away on 22 January 2007. Joe and Lillian had two children, Sandra and Joseph Michael (Mike), both of whom have had successful lives and careers.

Commander Joe McGrievy's decorations and awards include the Silver Star, (our Nation's Third Highest Award); the Navy Marine Corps Medal; Commendation Medal; the Submarine Combat Patrol Pin with 10 stars; Officer and Enlisted Submarine Qualification Pins; three Area Combat Ribbons; Philippine Defense Medal; Secretary of the Navy Achievement Award; American Defense with one star; Good Conduct Medal with four stars; Philippine Liberation Medal; and the World War Two Victory medal.
